Dear Mother:-

While my bother was here he proposed a plan to purchase from me the rights to publish the book Past Present and Future in foreign languages. The plan that was settled upon was as follows:

You are to have all rights to publish this book in all languages outside of the English, for two thousand dollars, to be paid in the following manner: \$600 to be paid at the rate of \$100 in money each two weeks. Second, \$400 to be applied on accounts that are now due you <sup>and</sup> notes, interest, etc. } \$1000 to be paid as the book is sold, at the rate of 5% on the retail price, until the sum of \$1000. is paid, and then all further payments cease, and it is entirely your property.

The above was the proposition that was made by W. C. and I accepted the proposition and agreed to send proofs of all the book that is now in plates as quickly as these proofs can be taken, and will follow this with proofs of other chapters as fast as they can be prepared. I think this covers the whole amount of the agreement which I hope will prove perfectly satisfactory.
