

RESOLUTIONS

PASSED BY THE
BOARD OF DIRECTORS
OF THE
Southern Publishing Association,

September 16th, 1901.

That the general business policy of the SOUTHERN PUBLISHING ASSOCIATION in its dealings with Conferences, Tract Societies, and other departments of the work, be such as to encourage the settlement of all accounts the first of each month.

To obviate the difficulty of our agents incurring debts beyond their ability to pay, that we require the first shipment of books to be paid for before a second shipment is forwarded.

That the Conferences organizing in the Southern Union Conference be requested to encourage canvassers to deal direct with the Association until such time as the general condition of the work and the financial ability of Conferences to properly conduct this line of work, warrant a change, for the following considerations:—

1. The Lord has definitely instructed us not to go into debt.
2. Young conferences are not financially capacitated for carrying on a regular book business.
