Bro. Hastings,

Please come to Townsend Depot for us Friday, 9th of March. I do not know at what hours the cars run. So you will meet us at the Depot at the arrival of the first train of cars unless the first trains leave Boston too early for us. In that case you will wait until the second train. Please come at your convenience at any hour but if the cars leave Boston as early as 8 p m. you may expect us. We shall be at the Depot unless we have to wait some time for you. Then in that case we might be at a publick house. If we are not at the Depot inquire at the publick house for James White.
