

GOD'S HAND IN THE S.D.A. SANITARIUM WORK

In December, 1865, a group of consecrated Christians gathered in Rochester, New York, and spent a week in protracted seasons of prayer for the restoration to health of Elder James White. Four months he had suffered from partial paralysis of his right arm and side.

He was greatly blessed but not fully healed. Instead of healing, revelations were given on Health Reform and a Health Institute.

In 1865, The Otsego Vision. Afternoon Council at home of Dr. H.S. Lay.

In 1864 and 1865, "How to Live" issued.

In August 1866, Health Institute opened. A steady growth with full support.

Ten years later, Dr. J.H. Kellogg was completing his medical course of studies, and his older brother, M.G. Kellogg, was one of the Sanitarium physicians. Having some disagreement with the former manager, he withdrew from the institution and came to S.F. This separation, like that of Paul and Barnabas led to the broadening of our Sanitarium work.

Just ten years ago, he gave me the following facts:

In the summer of 1877, he worked part time for the bath establishment of Barlow J. Smith in San Francisco. In the autumn, Dr. Smith moved to a place two miles west of Rutherford. He opened up treatment rooms there and Dr. Kellogg continued in his employ.

A.B. Atwood brought wife there for four weeks. Proposed that Dr. Kellogg have a place of his own. Spoke of beautiful spring.

Promotion plans reached \$6,000.00, December 1877.

Began work December 10. Soon had Brethren A.B. Atwood, F. and W. Lamb, A.H. Benson and James and Chas. Wilson at work. J.H. Morrison donated a strong team.

The place opened June 6, 1878, with fourteen patients. In five weeks the house was crowded and tents were pitched. At the end of five months the expenses had been met and \$5,000.00 gained.

Then came disagreements, and Dr. Kellogg left. The house was closed during the winter, and was operated during the summers of 1879 and 1880 as a resort. It was advertised as a good place for school teachers to rest.

In 1880, I tried to get Dr. Waggoner to take hold. Mother hunted for physicians and finally secured Mrs. DeYoung, an old style Hydropath, and Dr. J.S. Gibbs, later.

The managers were Brethren Atwood, Rogers, Fulton, Burden.

In 1883, Elder St. John came and was encouraged to build a home.

Plans to bring other ministers.
