Dear Sister

Your letter of October 14, addressed to Mrs. E.G. White, came duly to hand. Mother has read it and requests me to write to you in reply.

You say that you are a widow with two small children and an aged mother to support, and that you have a few thousand dollars that you could loan if well secured. Also that you know that Seventh-day Adventists borrow money, but you do not know to whom to write.

It seems to me that I could help you most by stating a few facts regarding our institutions, and then giving you the addresses of the treasurers of some of these institutions.

Our publishing houses in Washington, Mountain View, and Nashville are all strong financial concerns, and in each of these institutions their large and increasing business leads them to need to use borrowed money. I think they pay 5% interest.

Our larger sanitariums, such as the Washington Sanitarium at Takoma Park, Washington, D.C., the Melrose Sanitarium, at Melrose, Mass., near Boston, the Iowa Sanitarium at Nevada, Iowa, the Colorado Sanitarium at Boulder, Col., and the Loma Linda Sanitarium at Loma Linda, Cal., are each strong financial institutions, but their business like that of the publishing houses, has grown so rapidly and demanded such large investments that they also have to use borrowed money. I think they pay 5% interest. It is my opinion that money

is safer in these institutions than in the banks.

If you wish to learn particulars regarding any or all of these institutions, it is my opinion that Eld. R.A. Underwood, 2718 Third Ave. S., Minneapolis, Minn., who is President of the Northern Union Conference, would be qualified to give you full information and wise counsel. Elder W.T. Knox, Takoma Park, Washington, D.C., who is treasurer of our General Conference, would also be a wise counselor regarding places for safe investment.
