

W.C. White letter November 5, 1909

Takoma Park, Washington, D.C.

Dear Brother:

"As regards mother's experience in dealing with sickness, I will say this, that she has always endeavored to act in harmony with the light given her regarding the disuse of poisonous drugs. At the same time she has administered to her children and to others, simple remedies such as Castor Oil, rhubarb, eucalyptus, etc.

"When our brethren in foreign fields have told the story of their inability to cope with malarial fevers without the use of quinine, and have told her of saving life by its use, she has not reproved them, but has expressed the hope that the time would come when they would know how to deal with these fevers without the use of quinine."
