Your letter of August 8 to Mrs, E. G. White, has waited sometime for an answer.

Mother is now eighty six years old. She feels the infirmity of age and for about four years she has felt that the Lord has released her from the responsibility and burden of writing letters; therefore in accordance with her wish, I am writing to you in reply.

Your experience with spiritualism is very similar to that which has entered into the lives of many of my friends and acquaintances. In a few instances these people have been releaved all at once from the troublesome visits and interferences of the spirits, but in many instances the spirits have continued to visit and perplex them, and it it only by earnest prayer and steadfast faithfulness that they have become overcomers.

You should not feel that the experience you are passing through are necessarily evidences of sin, but you should lay
